FEDERATION OF HISTORIC MOTORING REPORT

Meetings August and October 2006

At the recent meetings of the F.H.M.C. of S.A. the following points were discussed. For those new members who are unaware, our club and 109 or so others are affiliated with the Federation. The Federation acts on behalf on many issues including Historic Registration, Bay to Birdwood Classic, special club runs, and insurance. Please note that my report is my own interpretation of the information given by either attendance at meetings or minutes of meetings. I don't expect all the issues I have outlined to be always relevant to us, but it gives some feedback on what the F.H.M.C. of S.A. represents.

The following matters were brought up at the meetings:

- · Transport S.A. have responded and stated that a review of the Historic rego scheme and Special Interest Vehicle is under way. A discussion paper will be released.
- · The McLaren Vale Vintage and Classic Day is on 29 April 2007.
- · The All Makes Swap Meet was on the 5th November at May Tce. Lockleys.
- · Log book return sheets are due.
- · There is still a chance that the current LPG stance could be softened. W.A. now allows LPG on Historic registered vehicles.
- The Bay to Birdwood had 1452 entries with 1150 pre 1950's vehicles. This is not enough to pay the bills. This is the Historic vehicle movement's biggest promotional tool and it is important to the movement to keep this event.
- Rory Forss (FHMS Special Projects Officer) has spoken to an ex BP boffin about our modern fuels. I mentioned the problems in my last report. I will quote what has been stated in the minutes. "Air contains moisture and the air/moisture/fuel interface in a fuel tank will initiate corrosion. If a car has to sit around "un used" it is wise to add a little bit of fuel now and again to keep the fuel changing. A small amount of upper cylinder lubricant will also leave an oily film as the level drops and reduce the chance for corrosion at the fuel air interface. There are also cream fuel tank sealants that put a non corrosive film on the inside of fuel tanks when the cream dries out. Modern fuel does deteriorate

with time. The lighter factions evaporate first and the tank contents can stratify as well. Anti "gum" preventers can drop out of the solution and then the valves "gum up".

- · 600 AHMF surveys have been returned of 7000 FHMC individual members.
- · All British Day is on February 11th 2007. I went last year, and it was a good day in the Adelaide Hills.
- · Kev's Tractor Collection is at Kingston in the S.E. 08 8767 2261. A friend of mine collects tractors; personally I think it's a bit weird!
- · *C* and *A* Complete Drive Solutions at Croydon Park make one off and small batches of parts for veteran and vintage vehicles. Ph 8444 6700.
- · 140 expressions of interest for the Mid North Meander.
- · Bay to Birdwood reports were generally good. The city detour was still not liked but it was not as bad as last time. There were 1486 entries.
- · New Log book covers not ready yet.
- The Vet and Vintage Chev Assoc of Aust, SA have advised the meeting that they would no longer run the GM day at Tanunda. (1st April 2007) The '55 '56 '57 Chev Club will.

HISTORIC REGISTRATION UPDATE

- There are 7 log books unsigned for 2006-2007 at present. Some of these vehicles are not being used at present. I will contact the owners.
- · One Log book has not been returned since the vehicle was sold.
- · All log books must be returned once a vehicle is sold. The new owner cannot use it.
- · We have 35 historically registered vehicles at present. That equates to 27 memberships.



REPRODUCTION PARTS

Adjustable Boot Spring Posts

Members of the FE-FC HCC of NSW have designed a new "adjustable boot spring post". These were once commonly sold in spares shops to repair broken or fatigued boot spring posts.

The other benefit of the adjustable springs is that the special spring tensioning tool is not required, and boot springs can be refitted without risk of losing skin or a finger.



Most of these original style adjustables are fairly unattractive, with a large bolt head showing through the boot strut pressing. The design philosophy of this new unit was to produce something that would be as inconspicuous as possible. Once in place, with a lick of paint, these bolts should be almost indistinguishable from the original post pressing.

The bolt and nut are made of Grade 5 hi-tensile steel, and the kit includes matched star washers (not shown). Note that this is not a standard coach-head bolt that has been cut down, but a custom manufactured item. The prototype has been fitted for several months in one



of the members' vehicles, and has proved quite successful. The kit will fit FE-EK sedans, including early FE models with 1/2" springs.

Price will be about \$35-\$40.

They are not in production yet, but if you are interested, let Martin Know and a bulk club order will go in.

Reproduction Horn Button

Rare Spares are about to produce a reproduction horn button that has been given the OK by the eastern states gurus. The picture on the internet looks very good, but it won't show up well in b&w, so I haven't reproduced it here. Price is expected



to be around \$125-, with availability probably around April.

period photos that included the odd FE and FC.




Thanks again to Martin for organising another great day out and well worth the trip.

Three Main ways to get there.

First (Easiest)

- Get onto Port Wakefield Road, continue to the Two Wells turn off and turn RIGHT into Two Wells.
- 2. Turn RIGHT at the Bakery, or if you miss that


- RIGHT at the Big Pub on the corner, this gets you onto the Gawler-Two Wells Road.
- 3. Head out about 10-12 kms, Pederick Road is on your left hand side. Turn RIGHT and keep going past Pederick Court, we are the 4th house past Pederick Court.

Second

- 1. Drive into Gawler and turn LEFT onto Twelfth Street (Mitre 10 on the Corner) continue along to the T-Junction and turn RIGHT onto Fifteenth Street and Overway Bridge Rd.
- 2. At the roundabout continue onto Ryde Street, first easy left on the roundabout.
- 3. Turn RIGHT at the next T-Juntion and you be on Gawler-Two Wells Road. You will pass over the Gawler By-Pass and the Glider Club/Trotting Track will be on your right
- 4. Head out through the 80kmh zone and into a 110kmh zone about 15kms from the last T-Junction. Pederick Road is on you left.
- 5. Keep going past Pederick Court, we are the 4th house past Pederick Court.

Third

- 1. Head north up Heaslip Road, through Angle Vale and past Trinity School, over Gawler River to the T-Junction.
- 2. Turn LEFT and continue to Boundary Road, too far and you hit dirt road.
- 3. Turn LEFT onto Hayman Road.
- 4. Turn RIGHT onto Pederick Road, 71 is on your LEFT.

This is the annual full club turn-out day. Cars will be inspected by our scrutineers and log books will be endorsed for another year.


