

# FHMC Report

Meeting OCTOBER 2007

At the recent meetings of the F.H.M.C. of S.A. the following points were discussed. For those new members who are unaware, our club and 130 or so others are affiliated with the Federation. The Federation acts on behalf on many issues including Historic Registration (HVRS), Bay to Birdwood Classic, special club runs, and insurance. Please note that my report is my own interpretation of the information given by either attendance at meetings or minutes of meetings. I don't expect all the issues I have outlined to be always relevant to us, but it gives some feedback on what the F.H.M.C. of S.A. represents.

The following matters were brought up at the meetings:

- · A presentation was given by an insurance broker on a National Scheme of Public Liability for Associations, officials, volunteers, for vehicle clubs. Examples of incidents that can cause claims are:
- 1. Sexual harassment
- 2. Club raffles
- 3. Volunteers worker's insurance
- 4. Club chat rooms and forums
- 5. Unregistered vehicles.
- 6. Unqualified Marshalls.
- 7. Poor renewal of club membership forms.
- 8. Poor record keeping of incidents. (6 years)
- 9. Vehicle displays and rally's.

I will talk about these at the next meeting.

#### HISTORIC REGISTRATION UPDATE



# Fond farewell to wagon

AS the recent farewell of the last Holden VZ Commodore station wagon to come off the production line at Elizabeth a final "goodbye forever"? Or was it merely a "see you later"? Holden introduced its station wagon 50 years ago, based on the old FE Holden in 1957.

It has not been making a station wagon version of the \$1 billion VE Commodore introduced a year ago but until last week has been making utes and station wagons based on the previous Commodore.

The utes stopped being made in July and Holden already has shown the new VE-based ute that will hit the roads from next month.

But it remains tight-lipped about any VE Commodore station wagon.

The last of the VZ models, a white station wagon going to a private buyer, was farewelled off the line at the Elizabeth plant by workers and GM Holden's manufacturing director Rod Keane.

It was based on the VT platform that began 10 years ago and subsequently updated with Commodore models known as the VX, VY and VZ - each of them Australia's most popular car of their time.

VT Commodore won the Wheels magazine Car of the Year announced in January, 1998. And VT, VX, VY and VZ Commodore-based V8 Supercars won seven consecutive Bathurst 1000 races, 1999-2005.

In all, 1,206,665 cars were built at Elizabeth on that VT platform – counting sedans, wagons, utes, the long wheelbase Statesman-Caprice and the hero Monaro coupe, including the U.S. Pontiac export versions of that. Mr Keane praised the

workers for their flexibility in having produced VZ wagons and utes while also making VE sedans and their Statesman-Caprice brothers at the same time over the past year.

GM Holden claims a number of "firsts" with the VT to VZ series, including traction control, which is now on all Holden's Australianmade cars. Another first for an Australian-built car was stability

control, initially on VZ Commodore Acclaim and Calais. Now all VE Commodores have ESP and it will also be on all of the coming VEbased utes.

The Elizabeth plant now becomes a VE-only car line, including ramping up for production of the VE ute and the U.S. export program of the Pontiac sedans.

"From October onwards, we will

see the plant operating at the maximum line rate of 620 cars a day," Mr Keane says. The company plans that by mid next year half its production will be export cars, largely to the Middle-East and the U.S. Pontiac program. Speculation abounds on whether a VE Commodore station wagon will emerge once the new ute is in production.



# The end of an era

THE Port Rd landscape has changed dramatically with the razing of the old GMH buildings at Woodville.

About 4000 tonnes of concrete and masonry and more than 2700 tonnes of steel are being shifted off site – one of the largest demolitions in metropolitan Adelaide in recent years.

It paves the way for a \$30 million Bunnings hardware outlet, which will form part of the new Charles Sturt Industrial Estate.

Construction company McMahon Services started the demolition work on March 1 and it is expected to be completed by the end of the month.

McMahon's demolition state manager Chris Latham said before the buildings could be razed nearly 40,000 sq m of asbestos cement roof sheeting and more than 20 cubic metres of other asbestos products had to be removed.

The buildings which have been knocked over were built in the 1950s and included an old tool room and pattern shop.

Holden's association with the Woodville site dates back to 1923 when Holden Motor Builders bought 23 acres of land to establish a manufacturing plant which opened the next year. General Motors Corporation bought the company in 1930 – which was renamed General Motors Holden (GMH) – and gradually expanded the site to more than triple its original size.

The majority of work for the first all-Australian car was done at the Woodville plant, including producing the car body. From 1958, GMH progressively shifted the plant's operations to its new Elizabeth site, before stopping production at the Woodville plant in 1962.



# BONNET-CATCH CARE

WHEN an alligator-type bonnet catch comes loose while the car is in motion, the results can be serious, as the driver is temporarily blinded by the bonnet. Such emergencies are often due to lack of attention to this vital part. Regular service should take the form of ensuring that all the working parts of the bonnet catch are free from dirt which may cause jamming. and are correctly lubricated so they operate freely. Also check the release cable, to ensure that this is well greased and not liable to stick, leaving the bonnet unsecured.

#### SIMPLE BRAKE BLEED

YOU can bleed hydraulic brake. lines easily, without the usual preliminary of obtaining a jar of brake fluid, if you use a strong spring-type clothespeg on a soft rubber hose con-When nected to the bleeder valve.



the pedal is depressed, there is sufficient pressure to blow fluid and air past the clothespeg; but it will close up instantly the moment the pedal is released, preventing air entering the brake system. If you wish, you can catch the fluid in a clean jar and replace it in the master cylinder.

### FITTING HOSES

BEFORE replacing radiator hoses, clean the rust and old gasket cement from the metal inlet and outlet pipes, then rub powdered graphite -obtainable at any hardware store or garage-on to the outside metal surface, the inside of the hose clamps, and on the inside and outside of the rubber hoses. This will permit easy tightening of the clamps, a snug fit, and quick removal next time.

### CARPET REPAIRS

If the carpets in the front of an older car are worn and a quick, presentable replacement job is needed take advantage of the section of carpet that usually lies under the front scat. This can be cut off and sewn in place of the worn section. If desired, the worn section can then be roughly repaired and sewn back in position under the seat.

For a more modern car it may be better to keep the "new" look, and replace the front carpet entirely. Rubber-backed carpet is now sold at a reasonable price. If the old carpet is either replaced or repaired, check the sections that are wearing more than others and cover them with rubber mats for extra protection.

#### KEEP SCREEN CLEAN

DIRT on the windscreen is one of the biggest causes of wiper-blade failures. When the blade is working on a clean wet screen there is little wear; but when the screen is dirty before the blades start working considerable abrasion results. Therefore it is wise to wipe over the screen, whenever possible, before setting the wipers in motion.

### PRESERVING TRIM

THE trim on the stanchion between front and back doors often wears excessively due to rubbing by driver and passengers when entering and leaving the car. This can result in an otherwise perfect car having a wellused look when it is offered for resale.

If you want to get the highest price for your car (and who doesn't?), you will find it worthwhile to protect this section when the car is new. This can be done by covering it with a piece of leather or plastic. The job will look quite neat if the trim is removed, the protecting piece wrapped around and sewn loosely in place, and the trim screwed firmly in position again. When you want to sell the car, simply remove the extra piece.
