FEDERATION OF HISTORIC MOTORING REPORT

Meeting February 2010

At the recent meetings of the F.H.M.C. of S.A. the following points were discussed. For those new members who are unaware, our club and 130 or so others are affiliated with the Federation. It represents 15,000 members and 11,000 vehicles. The Federation acts on behalf on many issues including Historic Registration (HVRS), Bay to Birdwood Classic, special club runs, and insurance. Please note that my report is my own interpretation of the information given by either attendance at meetings or minutes of meetings. I don't expect all the issues I have outlined to be always relevant to us, but it gives some feedback on what the F.H.M.C. of S.A. represents.

- The following matters were brought up at the meetings:
- · A comment was made about the number of Swap Meets that are occurring. There seems to be one at least every month.
- · Pre December 1918 veterans will get fee entry to the 2010 Bay to Birdwood but must start and finish under their own power.
- · The FHMC website is up and running.
- · The Variations list will soon appear on the website.
- · The Bay Classic made a small surplus.
- The 2010 Bay to Birdwood will have a maximum of 1500 vehicles. It will be the 30th anniversary.
- The Motofest 2010 is up and ready, and can be checked out on the website.
- · NOTE: The act of selling a vehicle cancels the registration. So, if you are selling a vehicle you could drive it to the new owners place and do the paperwork and transaction there.
- · You may have noticed on a voting slip recently a Political party called C.A.R.S. Peter Pangaris has organised a Party called Car Action and Road Safety (CARS). He is pushing for a Government that will support Road safety initiatives and Motorsport other than the Clipsal 500.

HISTORIC REGISTRATION UPDATE

This years Show and Shine was a little disappointing for signing Log Books. We had only 20 Log Books to sign with a remaining 12 still to be signed. I hope this is not a sign for the future. The day was enjoyable and we had good food and weather. I do understand that the timing being on Anzac Day and a long weekend would not have suited everyone. I was given a number of apologies and I thank members for this.

WALLY'S HISTORIC REGISTRATION QUESTIONS

WALLY: Well I'd like you to remember that some of us are getting older and we cannot remember all of these rules and regulations so what about that?

ANSWER: Wally, most clubs are run by people who do all the jobs for free and because they want to. They also know that once in a while, members make the odd mistake, but even allowing for old age, would you drive your modern car without rego? Also, it so often seems it's the same people every time and they don't seem to take the matter seriously when it's mentioned. Added to that, the problems are generally caused by the folk who simply pay their subs in order to get cheap rego and that gives club officials reasonable cause to feel the club and the system are being abused.

WALLY: You seem to make a fuss about members attending club events and meetings. Why's that?

ANSWER: For most clubs Wally, the subs you pay barely cover all the costs of running that club throughout the year. There's rent, insurance, newsletters to give just a few. So most clubs need to make a little extra money by way of raffles, trading tables or similar. That means the regular attending members actually subsidizes those who simply join in order to get the cheap rego.

WALLY: So do all the clubs make the same fuss as you do and if so, why and who oversees it all?

ANSWER: In South Australia, we have the Federation of Historic Motoring Clubs. All the clubs who are eligible to have members participating in the MVRS are members of this Federation. In turn, the Federation liaises with the Registrar of Motor Vehicles Department. Only approved clubs can provide the process needed for you to obtain the Historic Registration. If a club was seen to have failed to have acted within the terms of what is called the Code of Practice, then the club could lose its approval and the members would then have to look to another club. That is why our club takes its role seriously.

WALLY: Well I've got a mate who's got a car with flash alloy wheels and some other modifications, so how come he gets away with it?

ANSWER: Well Wally, if our mate has got a car that is 30 years of age or older and he wants to have what might be termed as non conforming items, he can still be in a club but should not be allowed the rego under the HVRS. At the same time, a small number of clubs might appear to be somewhat easier on the vehicles they give approval to, but that is their choice and if this is the case, they run the risks involved. The HVRS does have sensible provisions for certain cars to have items fitted that were not original, simply because they are no longer available. These cases are dealt with by the club involved and the Federation, in the best interests of preserving the heritage of our motor vehicles and the owners.




