Meeting June 2010

At the recent meetings of the F.H.M.C. of S.A. the following points were discussed. For those new members who are unaware, our club and 130 or so others are affiliated with the Federation. It represents 15,000 members and 11,000 vehicles. The Federation acts on behalf on many issues including Historic Registration (HVRS), Bay to Birdwood Classic, special club runs, and insurance. Please note that my report is my own interpretation of the information given by either attendance at meetings or minutes of meetings. I don't expect all the issues I have outlined to be always relevant to us, but it gives some feedback on what the F.H.M.C. of S.A. represents.

- -The following matters were brought up at the meetings:
- The Bay to Birdwood has 454 entries with 27 veterans. Well up in numbers at present.
- Ethanol is not good for rubbers and other old fashioned gaskets that old vehicles use and you should do some testing before using ethanol fuels. SA's 10% may be alright but some states allow higher levels.

ANSWER: Well, Wally, the club officials generally like to attend and enjoy meetings and events themselves, so I'll give you a few tips on how to keep them happy! Follow these points below and the club will flourish.

- Remember that for many, this role is not their day job, so please respect their time.
- Get your responsibilities done in plenty of time. That means paying your subs as early as possible and not waiting for club officials to remind you. Don't leave these until you are about to head of to an event.
- Please be patient as on some nights, several members all want matters sorted out.
- Ensure you get your latest rego slip stamped.
- Follow the instructions on how the club will deal with the log book processing.
- Make sure you have a log book that is valid and signed.
- If you are not sure about something, please ask.
- Take part, not advantage

PRESIDENTS REPORT

JULY 2010

At the last meeting in July it was noted that we have only 25 paid up members. Usually we have around 35 and sometimes up to 45. This is a little concerning. We have a *very* flexible grace period for payment of these fees, with the membership deadline being at the end of July, even though they are due in April - try doing this with your gas bill!!! Don't forget that you will not be registered for Historic Registration if you don't pay your fees. Kathy also stated that if you don't keep up your fee payment, you loose your club number and get a different one. Whilst this may not be of a concern to many, those of us with low numbers may wish to hold on to them.

I put some challenges to the members at the meeting concerning a couple of issues that keep reappearing. The first one being each member's commitment to club runs, and the other contributing to the newsletter. Yes, you have heard it all before if you have been a member for a while. At the meeting members overwhelmingly supported my thoughts and ideas on this. In fact they went further than what I first proposed, with quite a few people making suggestions and comments.

As a result, members decided that all members of our club commit themselves to three club runs per calendar year including the Compulsory Show and Shine (Metropolitan members only). If this happens we will see more cars and more people on our runs, rather than the same group of regulars. This is what our club is about. More on this later.

I know everyone understands our club aims, but I will re-emphasise them. We as a club believe that if you become a member of our club that you will be involved in our club, and that includes club runs, meetings and social events. This will reward the great deal of work that some members are doing in preparing these activities. Remember, your daily dive car *is* accepted on club runs! The club is about getting together, having fun and sharing ideas – not just about handing out cheap rego!

It was also overwhelmingly supported (except one member) at the meeting the idea that all members will contribute to the newsletter in some way. Therefore, we will elect 2 members from the club to contribute something towards the newsletter every time a newsletter is released. At present we have newsletters every 2 months. This will mean that you will only have to have an item to be published every 2 or 3 years! It is not a big commitment. The article can be virtually anything and it doesn't have to be car related. Your best jokes, holiday snaps, baby photos, recipes, car pictures, your life's story etc. will do. We will draw up a list and give you a reminder.






Our Club Run May 2010






Our Club Run May 2010

Member's Cars and Story

Hi Everyone, Our names are Stephen & Vida Schild, and we are members of the FE FC Holden Car Club of SA. We lived in Adelaide for approximately 35 years and decided to make the move to a better lifestyle, now that the nest is empty, so we now reside in a small stone cottage on approximately 11 acres of hilly land at Waitpinga, just on the outskirts of Victor Harbor.

Our hobby is collecting anything old and interesting, but mainly old Service Station Memorabilia. We have a collection of old Petrol Pumps (Bowsers) enamel signs, oil bottles and lots of small interesting items that relate to Service Stations including tins.

After moving to Waitpinga, it took a couple of years to get the house and grounds in a reasonable condition, we also built a large shed to house our collection, while this was happening we were also restoring a 1949 Francis Barnett motorcycle, so decided to join the local car club, which is The Victor Harbor Historic Car Club, where we met some interesting and nice people who owned a wide variety of cars, ranging from the early 1900's to some classics of the 50's and 60's. It was during one of the meetings we heard about a FC Holden sitting in a collectors shed, with low mileage and no body rust. It took a couple of weeks to convince the owner of the FC that we were interested restoring the car and not buying it for resale. Once this hurdle was overcome, we proceeded to purchase the car at the price he wanted for it!! ...

The car is a 1958 FC Holden Special, with 45,000 original miles on the speedometer, a handwritten log book by the original owner with all service details and the work that had been carried out on it, the colour of the car is Granite Grey with India Ivory flash and roof, and lucky for us all the interior was almost as new with no work required to upgrade, except for a clean. We drove the car around for a few months in the condition it was purchased in, but as it had been in a shed for many years near the seaside, it had surface rust on the top of the bonnet, roof and boot. The car looked OK when polished, from a distance on dark night with no moon, but in November 09, we decided it was time to give her a coat of paint. I was going to tackle the painting of the car myself in the shed, but as I was not confident of doing the best job we decided to get the car sprayed professionally. As we know once a car is stripped down for a paint job, there are lots of little things to replace and upgrade to make it more reliable, so we proceeded to fit all new welsh plugs, steel timing gears, gaskets, overhaul gearbox with a kit, door rubbers, bailey channels, complete re-chrome, with all stainless trim polished etc, etc.

As at the present day our FC is back in our shed with a new paint job and is a couple of weeks away from completion, engine installed and running, new door rubbers installed front and rear windscreens installed with the next big job being new Bailey Channels..

We are looking forward to taking the car out on the next FC Club run... Stephen & Vida Schild


