Meeting OCTOBER 2010

At the recent meetings of the F.H.M.C. of S.A. the following points were discussed. For those new members who are unaware, our club and 130 or so others are affiliated with the Federation. It represents 15,000 members and 11,000 vehicles. The Federation acts on behalf on many issues including Historic Registration (HVRS), Bay to Birdwood Classic, special club runs, and insurance. Please note that my report is my own interpretation of the information given by either attendance at meetings or minutes of meetings. I don't expect all the issues I have outlined to be always relevant to us, but it gives some feedback on what the F.H.M.C. of S.A. represents.

*-*The following matters were brought up at the meetings:

- · Bay to Birdwood report. A few delays, but generally a good run. 1300 vehicles attended.
- There was a L34 Torana "look a like" done up in Holden Dealer colours applying for Historic rego. The FHMC will investigate as there is some belief it could pass. It is a bit like the orange racing FE at the last Nationals.

If we have a club event and in the very and almost impossible event one of us breaks down and calls the RAA, we should say we are "just out for a drive" rather than "we are on a rally". Which we are anyway.

Gordon Cowley says "give CAMS the flick" in reference to our letter from CAMS asking clubs to join their association.

The Milang Vintage and Machinery Club has it's 2 day event at the Milang oval on 22 & 23rd of January 2011.

Paint on HVRS vehicles come up again. A 1950's style truck has a modern style phone number on it. Rather than an old one. This is seen as advertising.

The Adelaide Hot Rodders have been approved for HVRS. Suitable vehicles can only get approval of course.

Member's Cars and Story

Peter & Lauren Mitchell FC Restoration

Born in 1959, this FC Holden has been owned by George and Elsie Maggs for its entire life.

In 2009 a restoration project was started to restore the FC back to roadworthy condition.

This story starts back in 1959 when this 2 tone grey Holden FC Special Sedan rolled off the GMH production line in Adelaide.

The car was soon delivered to the new owners George and Elsie Maggs via a local Holden dealer. Original purchase price was around one thousand pounds.

Used as a daily driver, caravan tow car and general family car, it served its purpose well until late 70's.

At this time the car had a rest in the shed due to some rust problems in the floor pan. The new family car was a HJ Holden with 253 V8

My earliest memories are in the early 80's when Grandad (George) used to reverse the car out of the shed and run the motor to keep the systems fresh. Due to the seats being removed for floor repairs, we had to sit on Oil drums as seats.

I affectionately remember the FC as the "old bomb" and ever since a little kid wanted to do something special with this car.

Late 2008 we started slowly to get the project underway. Easter 2009 the project was pushed into full speed when it was relocated from Uranquinty (near Wagga NSW) to Adelaide. A full restoration is planned with the final result being a neat and tidy car that closely resembles the car that rolled off the production line back in 1959.
